



Children Online

Computers have traditionally been trusted by both children and adults as reliable and accurate sources of information. The rapid growth of online services and internet access has added a new dimension to modern computing. There can be real dangers for an unsupervised child.

Most parents teach their children not to talk to strangers, not to open the door if they are alone and not to give out information on the telephone to unknown callers. Most parents also monitor where their children go, who they play with and what TV shows, book or magazines they are exposed to. However, many parents don't realize that the same level of guidance and supervision must be provided for a child's online experience.

Suggestions for Parents

- Limit the amount of time a child spends online and surfing the web
- Teach a child that talking to screen names in a chat room = talking to a stranger
- Never give a child credit card numbers or passwords for use online
- Teach a child never to give out any personal identifying information to anyone online
- Teach a child to never agree to actually meet someone they have met online
- Make use of parental control features offered with your online service
- Teach a child to use the same courtesy in communication with others online as they would in person...no vulgar language, no name calling
- Insist that a child follow the same guidelines at other computers they might have access to such as school, libraries, or friend's homes.

Parents should remember that communication online does not prepare children for real interpersonal relationships. Spending time with a child initially exploring an online service and periodically participating with a child in the online experience gives parents an opportunity to monitor and supervise the activity. It is also an opportunity to learn together.

Drayton Showered With Appreciation

Dr. and Mrs. Jerry Drayton were showered with appreciation during an "Evening of Appreciation" on Friday, November 10, 2006 at the Grand Pavilion Ballroom of Embassy Suites Hotel in downtown Winston-Salem. The evening was the culmination of 62 years of service to New Bethel Baptist Church. Mrs. Tina Carson-Wilkins was Mistress of Ceremony.

The dais was escorted in by hosts and hostesses from New Bethel and announced by Mrs. Wilkins. Mayor Allen Joines praised Dr. Drayton for easing racial tension in the city during the 60s. He also presented him with a "key" to the city and declared the day, "Dr. Jerry Drayton Day!" Ms. Shareé Posey gave remarks on the Occasion. Mrs. Diane Piggott extolled the virtues of Mrs. Susie Drayton who has stood by her husband for more than 60 years. A final tribute before dinner was a video presentation produced by Mrs. Brenda Redd. She chronicled Drayton's Legacy of 62 years along with some historical highlights of New Bethel. The Communion Singers provided the music for the evening and offered "Have Faith" as its first selection.

Dinner was delicious! It consisted of a garden salad, roasted chicken breast, juicy roast beef, green beans, rice pilaf, rolls with butter, assorted desserts, tea and coffee.

After dinner, Ms. Audrey Brown introduced Dr. J. C. Harris, Pastor of First Baptist Church of Statesville and Executive Secretary-Treasurer of the Rowan, who was the keynote speaker. Mrs. Redd returned to the podium to present several gifts to the Draytons.

Dr. C. R. Edwards, Senior Advisor of Community Affairs of the Governor's Office recalled how early during his years of study at Shaw University, he had met Drayton. He commended him for his service to the State of North Carolina. Dr. Gregory K. Moss, President of the General Baptist State Convention, commended Dr. Drayton for his many years of service and noted, "this is my first act since being elected president of the body." Also, the Reverend Clary Phelps, Moderator of the Rowan Association, Dr. Vivian Burke, Mayor Pro-Tem and Northeast Ward Councilwoman, and Mr. Nelson Malloy, Jr., Councilman for New Bethel's North Ward gave remarks.

The honorees' son, Mr. Jerry Alonzo "Al" Drayton gave an outstanding salute to his parents that told of his love and appreciation for them. He remarked, "I see Dad continuing to build on his 68 years in the ministry and blazing into new adventures." Drayton has been named "Pastor Emeritus" of New Bethel. Dr. Kendall D. Jones, Sr., Senior Pastor of New Bethel, ended up the remarks. The Communion Singers came back with a very fitting selection, "Born Again."

As the evening was drawing to an end, Rev. H. Wesley Wiley, Pastor Emeritus of Second Baptist Church in Washington, D.C., entered after being delayed by traffic. His presence was acknowledged and he was escorted to the podium. He announced that his association with Drayton began about 61 years ago while attending a Lott-Carey Convention in Richmond, Virginia. He gave remarks of his long association. He was the banquet speaker for Dr. Drayton's 50th anniversary celebration. He was witty and entertaining!

Dr. Drayton gave remarks and the evening closed with the singing of his favorite hymn, "Leaning On The Everlasting Arms." Ministers, church members and friends numbered about three hundred at the appreciation service. Mrs. Dollye Mack and Ms. Towanna VanEaton provided the music for the Communion Singers. Trustee Jerry C. Gilmore, III provided limousine service for the occasion.
