

### Church Adopts Budget For 2006-2007

New Bethel Baptist Church members approved a budget for the fiscal year of 2006-2007 during the Annual Church Meeting held on Wednesday, December 13, 2006. This was the first official church meeting held with our new Senior Pastor, Dr. Kendall D. Jones, Sr.

The Financial/Treasurer's report was presented by Deacon Thomas Thornton and provided a complete financial report accounting for all monies, investments, and account balances.

Trustee Daniel Piggott presented the report from the Audit Committee. There were no recommendations again this year from the committee. The committee found all processes to be in place and that receipts of all monies received and disbursed had been documented as requested.

The Budget Committee report was presented by Trustee Kenneth Rocker. He proposed a total projected budget for 2006-2007.

Deacon Douglas Joyner, Maintenance Committee Chairperson, provided an update on repairs completed at the church.

Trustee James Brown, Personnel Committee Chairperson, provided an update from that committee. The committee is in the process of updating job descriptions for all paid staff at New Bethel.

The recommendations for 2006-2007 were as follows:

1. Access 20% of Auxiliary monies to place in the church budget
2. Discontinue the weekly finance income on the Sunday Bulletin
3. Church be given a weekly report (Church's Income) upon request
4. Individual Reports of Annual giving will be mailed to home address (this includes contributions made by visitors)
5. New Staff Persons will be:
  - a. Minister of Music
  - b. Saxophonist
  - c. Drummer
  - d. Church Secretary
  - e. Data Entry/Financial Assistant
6. Observe Casual Sunday
7. Observe Pastor's Anniversary on the 2nd Sunday in October (October 14, 2007)
8. Add Trustee James Brown to the Budget Committee
9. Add Mrs. Eva McWillis to the Finance Committee
10. Acceptance of Outreach Ministries Presidents and Chairmen for 2007
11. Acceptance of Deacon Matthew Moore as Sunday School Superintendent

Dr. Jones thanked the huge crowd of members for attending his first official church meeting. All recommendations were approved.

The Youth Council and the Baptist Training Union treated the youth to fruit bags. These were passed out following the morning service in the Hamlin Annex.


