

Minister Beverly Alexander, Associate Minister of Galilee Missionary Baptist Church brought to the 60th annual observance of Women's day at New Bethel Baptist Church a message that "God Has Brought Us From A Zero to a Hero" on Sunday, May 6, 2007 at 11 a.m. The Women used as a theme: "Drawing Near to God Through Study of His Word, Teaching, Praise and Fellowship."

Minister Alexander came to the pulpit as cries of "Hallelujah" filled the air as the choir finished singing, "The Lord Is Blessing Me Right Now." She continued the singing of the song and shouted, "You are looking at a miracle and turn up my mike and help me sing this song!" Minister Alexander stressed "Jesus did not stop this woman. He knew she was a prostitute and Jesus had to get Simon straight." Alexander remarked, "He had to be a brother!"

"We are all zeroes until we meet the hero—Jesus! Jesus said to the woman, "You are forgiven!" Her faith saved her! In conclusion, Minister Alexander reiterated, "I know Jesus can make a hero out of a zero!"

Mrs. Cynthia Curtis presented, "Woman of the Year" honors to Mrs. Nira Robinson.


Music will be provided by several soloists. A slide-show presentation will highlight historical events and missions of New Bethel through the years.


