

Rev. Diane Horton Earns Master Of Divinity Degree

Rev. Dianne Horton has successfully completed her studies at Wake Forest University School of Divinity. This academic milestone was celebrated during the graduation weekend of May 15-17.

The celebrating began on Saturday evening, May 15th, at the Divinity School Hooding Ceremony in Wait Chapel. Tradition holds that the Divinity School faculty selects a passage from the Bible that reflects each student's spiritual journey and theology. The selection is read as the student is hooded. As Rev. Horton was hooded by Dr. Mark Jensen, Associate Dean Jill Cranshaw read Psalms 62:1-2. "For God alone my soul waits in silence; from him comes my salvation. He alone is my rock and my salvation, my fortress; I shall never be shaken."

On Sunday, May 16th, the Divinity School joined in with the larger campus for the Baccalaureate Service. Graduation Day was on Monday, May 17th. The Master of Divinity Degrees were conferred at the campus wide commencement held at LJVM Coliseum in the morning. The Divinity School held its private commencement program in the afternoon in the Benson Center on the Wake Forest campus. It was during this ceremony that Rev. Horton received her Master of Divinity Degree. She also shared the honor of receiving the John Thomas and Dorothy Porter Award in Vocational Formation and Community Ministry with a dear friend and fellow graduate, Rev. Oliver Thomas. The two were recognized by Dean Bill Leonard for the significant commitment to ministry in the broad context of Christian ministry. Both have demonstrated a keen desire in working towards racial reconciliation with the Church.

While working towards her degree Rev. Horton completed a summer internship in Clinical

The charge for guest speakers will be moved back to the auxiliaries for speakers for special programs, etc. This change will be retroactive to November 1, 2009 which is the first quarter of our fiscal year.

Deacon Carolyn Crosby presented the Finance Committee and emphasized the importance of turning in all monies collected to be deposited in the church's general account which includes checks and cash.
