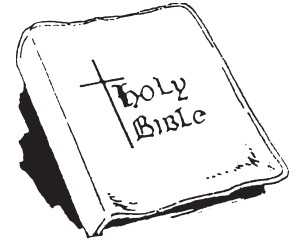

Mrs. Peggy McCullough Named "2011 Woman of the Year"

Mrs. McCullough, who was involved in a serious accident recently when she was hit by an SUV and another car, was shocked. She had just returned to church after the accident and never thought she would be chosen. She stated

that no one has ever been happier than she was. Her husband, William H. McCullough and mother Mrs. Ethel Brooks cried and expressed their joy and happiness.

For more than 33 years the "2011 Woman of the Year" has served New Bethel in many capacities. WILL STUDY FOR DOCTORATE DEGREE**

Jessica Leach Earns Master's Degree

Jessica A. Leach received her Master's Degree in Public Health with a concentration in Health Policy, Law, and Ethics from the University of Virginia on May 22nd, 2011. Her graduating thesis was titled, "Consumer Perspectives on Sharing Medical Information." She conducted 6 focus groups throughout Virginia to gather information about how people might feel about sharing their personal genetic information with selected others, and what capabilities they would want to see in a computerized tool that would allow them to record, organize, and present information. In Charlottesville, she interned with Sisters Conquering Cancer, an African American Cancer awareness group where she was a community health educator and participated in health programs emphasizing cancer prevention through physical activity, healthy eating, and timely cancer screenings. She assisted in conducting and evaluating prevention health programs, and grant writing. As an intern for the UVA Cancer Clinic she worked with the Virginia Cancer Plan Action Coalition where she assisted in developing a Colon Cancer Free Zone worksite plan that will be implemented throughout the state. This past semester she was a research assistant for the prenatal Educational Video Study where she recruited and enrolled low-income mothers seen in clinic into a clinical study. She conducted follow-up interviews with participants on their feeding habits and attitudes of individual nursing behaviors. While at UVA she has been a research analyst for UVA Center for Survey Research (CSR) where she helps design health surveys, and conduct qualitative and quantitative research. She will continue work at CSR throughout the summer. She plans to work for a couple of years, and then return to school to receive her doctorate.

Jessica is the daughter of Trustee and Mrs. Jerry (Rometta) Leach and sister of Jennifer Leach.
