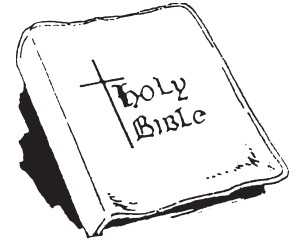

### Clemons Reveals How "To Be Set Free"

Rev. Darrick L. Clemons delivered an initial sermon on Sunday, May 27, 2012 during the 11 a.m. service at New Bethel Baptist Church which he entitled, "To Be Set Free." He used for a text, Psalms 126: 1-6. Rev. Dianne Horton was Worship Leader.

The song, "Change" led by Mrs. Peggy McCullough set the tone for a wonderful message. Rev. Clemons rose to his feet and took a few jubilant jumps prior to beginning his message. He declared, "Everybody has change in their life and I thank God I'm not what I used to be!" He continued, "Some think of being 'set free' as being free from jail; others say they are 'set free' when they drop the kids off for the weekend; or others want to 'be free' from a relationship; or still others think of 'being free' as with Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., but we must make God and his gift the focus of our lives." He admonished, "When you trust in God, everything will be alright—that lying tendency will vanish, that part-time Christian lifestyle will cease, and that negative spirit will depart. There are things in life that hold us back."

In conclusion, Clemons remarked, "A life apart from God should be enough to get us to go out into the world and spread the gospel!"

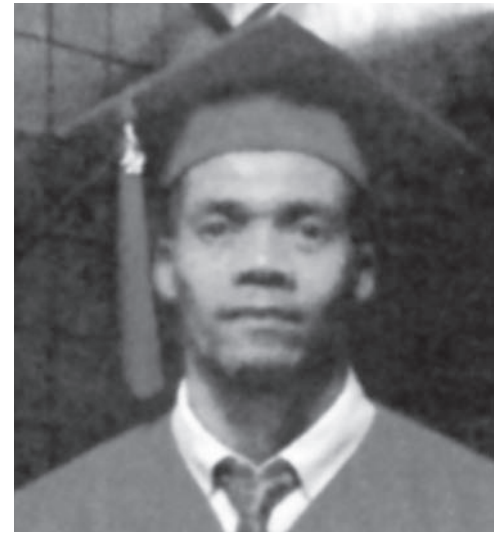

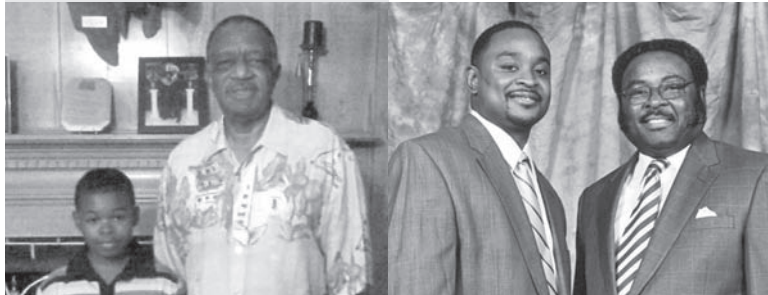
companies and events throughout the southeastern region of the United States. He received many rewards for his sculptures and culinary creations.
