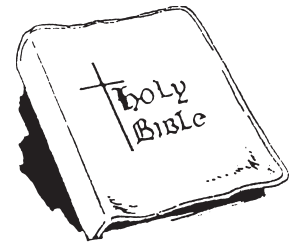

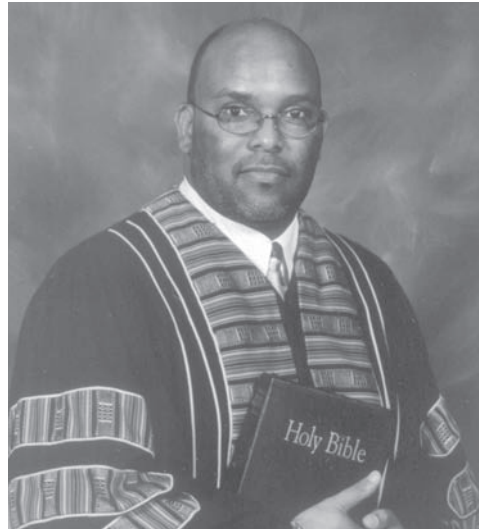
Dr. Kendall D. Jones, Sr. Is Laymen's Day Speaker

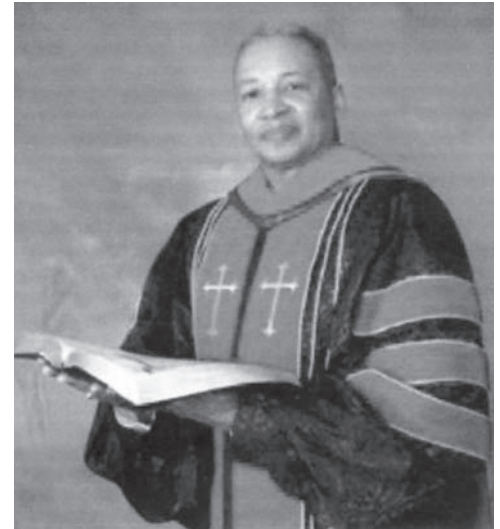

Dr. Kendall D. Jones Sr. to Celebrate 5th Pastoral Anniversary

On Sunday, October 9, 2011 the New Bethel Baptist Church Family will celebrate the 5th Pastoral and the 28th Ministerial Anniversary of Pastor Dr. Kendall D. Jones, Sr. The speaker for the occasion will be the Rev. Dr. C. Lee Hagwood, the founding prelate and senior pastor of Agape Bible Christian Fellowship of Martinsville, Virginia.

Dr. Jones began the pastoral leadership at New Bethel on September 1, 2006 with installation services being held on October 8, 2006. Dr. Jones and his wife Mae have two sons. Under his

leadership the membership has grown, attendance at both Monday and Tuesday Bible Study classes has increased along with the number of Associate Ministers. Two additional Associates were ordained this year after completion of Catechism. His other accomplishments include the establishment of Children's Church, a Senior Ministry, Health Ministry and Community Garden. Baptismal services were moved to Sunday morning, a new member's class was established, and the women of New Bethel held their first Women's Retreat in September 2009. Dr. Jones was also selected to travel to the Holy Land along with Pastors from several states in February of 2009 through Wake Forest University-School of Divinity.

Rev. Dr. Hagwood cumulated his practice of ministry with academic validation in 2008. He earned the Doctor of Ministry in Renewal of the Church for Mission from the Eastern University's Palmer Theological Seminary. He serves as Assistant Professor of Ministry at Carolina Evangelical Divinity School and Adjunct Instructor of Religion and Humanities at Danville Community College. Dr. Hagwood and his wife Lealice have four sons.

A special anniversary program will be held during the worship service. Ms. Audrey Brown and Ms. Linda Feemster are Co-Chairpersons of the Music Ministry. They will be assisted by Mr. Brushawn McKinney, Mrs. Peggy McCullough, Mr. Monte Odom, Master BreShaun Liles, and Mr. Willie Malachi.

A Black and White Gala will also be held at the Hawthorne Inn and Conference Center.
