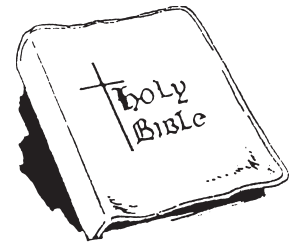

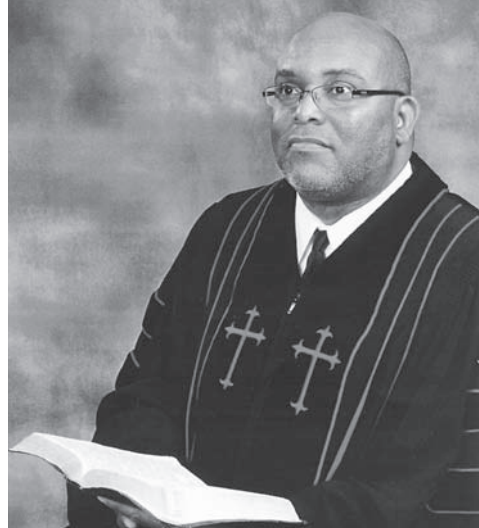
Bishop Fulton is a Magna Cum Laude graduate of Shaw University where he received his B.A. Degree in criminal Justice with a

variety of medical units including Neonatal Intensive Care, Pediatric and Adolescent Medicine, Day Hospital, Infectious Diseases, Transplant, General Surgery and Oncology. However, when the time came to select a specialty, Rev. Horton chose three areas of care for concentrated study; Adult Behavioral Health, Palliative Care, and the Emergency Department (Adult and Pediatric). These three specialty areas afforded Rev. Horton the opportunity to lead spiritual support groups, accompany patients on their end of life journey, minister to bereaved families, support staff suffering from compassion fatigue and to provide crisis ministry at a Level I Trauma Center. ## Dynamic Trio Good For The Soul

Dr. Dennis Leach, Pastor of Morning Star Missionary Baptist Church, Rev. Burrell Brooks, Pastor of St. John's Baptist Church of Statesville, and Rev. Shannon Jessup, Pastor of Second New Bethel Church teamed up to bring three soul-stirring nights of revival from Tuesday, September 18 to Thursday, September 20, 2012. The evening services began each day at 6:45 p.m. with devotion and the Willie Mason and Friends bringing a Music Ministry.

Dr. Leach opened Tuesday with his subject, "More Than Just Words" using as his text, St. John 1:1-3, 14. He reminded us that "God and His Word are one. What God says, God does. What God promises, God delivers. They are more than just words because they come with actions. God wants us to mean what we say. You cannot separate what God said and what God did!"

Rev. Brooks continued with the subject, "How to Live in the Midst of Hell" with his text, Jeremiah 29:7. He began "The people of God were in a hellish situation. They wouldn't listen to the words of Jeremiah. Many situations leave us depressed, defeated and discouraged." Rev. Brooks wants us to learn to live with what God permits. He stressed, "The reason you're still in a situation is because He wants you to know how to handle the situation, but just because you are going through hell, you don't have to lose your sense of purpose. People are watching you to see how you are handling your hell. Learn to live with prayer. Learn to live with patience and learn to live with God's purpose. And in conclusion, God's got a plan for you!"

Rev. Jessup wrapped up the week reminding us with his subject, "Praise Is What I Do" from Psalms 107:1-8. Rev. Jessup stressed that, "we need to give God praise. The only requirement for praise is that you are breathing." He added, "I came by to tell you when life has dealt its toughest blows, you must give God praise. It startles me when I go to church and nobody is giving God praise. Praise is how we tell God thank you."

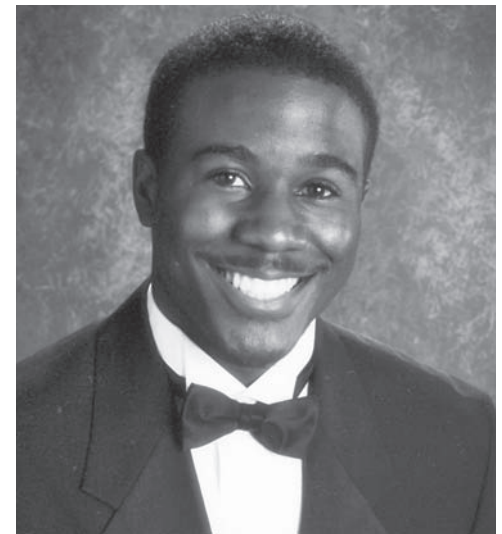
